Poganowo (settlement complex with cult place), Bezławki (Teutonic Order castle, prussian hillfort), Święta Lipka (pilgrimage church Our Lady of Święta Lipka, one of oldest pilgrimage sanctuaries in Poland, situated probably near former prussian cult place), Garbno (former Lamgarben, pruss. Laumygarbis – place of destroyed Teutonic Order castle, probably formerly prussian cult place near settlement complex with hillfort), Oświn Lake (Lake Assuenus, Asvinas - in border of former Prussian Bartia, with underwater, palafit type settlement from Early Iron Age, cemeteries from Roman and Migration Period, prussian hillforts and probably cult place in Guja – pruss. Goy), bonfire farewell party in forest.
